To yet another, it is the source of water for his fields. But to devout Hindus, it is a river, mother, and a goddess all in one. Its water is holy. The Ganga is holy for the living as well as the dead. After death, the ashes of most Hindus are consigned to the sacred water of the Ganga, which is supposed to give salvation.

The Ganga has deep associations with our history, religion, and culture. Rishis and Sages meditated on the banks of the Ganga in ancient times. Convenience of water transport encouraged the growth of cities on its banks. Great cities like Varanasi, Prayag, Rishikesh and Haridwar were built on its banks. They are all well-known as places of pilgrimage. The Ganga has witnessed some of the most eventful happenings in Indian history. It has witnessed *yagyas*, as well as battles on its banks.

According to Hindu mythology, the Ganga descended to the earth as a result of the efforts of king Bhagiratha to win *moksha* for his ancestors. The king led an ascetic life and offered prayers for many years. It was, then that the Ganga came to the earth to take into her lap the bones and ashes of the dead, washing away the sins of the dead as well as those who lived and had a dip in her holy waters.
