remit (noun) – the area that a person or group of people in authority has responsibility for or control over.

Ex: The remit of this official inquiry is to investigate the reasons for the accident.

Among the given statements, Option B seems to portray the exact denotation of the provided word.

Hence, the correct answer will be option B.

**2. Across the board**

Across the board (phrase) – applying to all.

Ex: The government decided to raise taxes across the board, drawing the ire of the general public.

Hence, the correct answer will be option C.

### 3. Trajectory

trajectory (noun) – the curved path that an object follows after it has been thrown or shot into the air.

Ex: The missile came in on a very low trajectory.

#### 4. Ripple effect

ripple effect (noun) – a situation in which one event produces effects which spread and produce further effects.

Ex: The bank crash has had a ripple effect on the whole community.

Hence, the correct answer will be option A.

Ex: We need to look at the logistics of the whole aid operation.

Among the given statements, Option E seems to portray the exact denotation of the provided word.

Hence, the correct answer will be option E.

**6. Push up**

push up (phrasal verb) – increase, raise.

Ex: I pushed her up so she could scale the wall.

Ex: We could see a row of camels silhouetted on the horizon.

Hence, the correct answer will be option D.

### 8. Hard-earned

Hard-earned (adjective) – If something is hard-earned, you deserve it because you have worked hard for it.

Ex: People feel they are being cheated out of their hard-earned cash.

Among the given statements, Option B seems to portray the exact denotation of the provided word.

Hence, the correct answer will be option B.

### 9. Credibility

B

### Solution

credibility (noun) – the fact that someone can be believed or trusted.

Ex: His arrest for lewd behaviour seriously damaged his credibility as a religious leader.

Among the given statements, Option A seems to portray the exact denotation of the provided word.

Hence, the correct answer will be option A.

**A word has been given in the following question. In response to the highlighted word, sentences have been provided in the options below. Find the appropriate statement representing the given word.**

#### 10. Convene

**A** The council will be *convening* on the morning of the 25th.

**B** My teenager needs to realize losing her lipstick is not a *convene*.

C Why is it hard to imagine *convence*?" said Kamyra.

D Selt-trust is the *convene* of heroism.

E She wasn't going to spend her *convene* days with someone who didn't care for her.

### Solution

The correct answer is Option A, i.e. The council will be convening on the morning of the 25th.

convene (verb) – to bring together a group of people for a meeting, or to meet for a meeting.

Ex: The council will be convening on the morning of the 25th.

Among the given statements, Option A seems to portray the exact denotation of the provided word.

Hence, the correct answer will be option A.
