The word 'augmentation' is the synonym of the word as it means 'the action or process of making or becoming greater in size or amount.'

The meanings of the other words:

negotiation: discussion aimed at reaching an agreement.

arbitration: the use of an arbitrator to settle a dispute.

pondering: think about (something) carefully.

Hence, option C is correct.

The meanings of the other words:

apposite: apt in the circumstances or in relation to something.


admissible: acceptable or valid.

Solution

The meaning of the word unscrupulous is 'having or showing no moral principles; not honest or fair.'

'conscientious' is the antonym of the given word as it means 'wishing to do one's work or duty well and thoroughly.'

The meanings of the other words:

treacherous: guilty of or involving betrayal or deception.

devious: showing a skilful use of underhand tactics to achieve goals.

sneaky: furtive; cunning.

Hence, option A is the correct answer.

In the question below, a word is given followed by three sentences. Find out the sentences in which the given word suits the best. If none of the sentences look appropriate as per the word, mark your answer as "All are correct".

6. CLANDESTINE.

- I. Leaks have exposed some of the agency's most *clandestine* intelligence-gathering operations.

In this regard, only sentence I seem to be coherent with the word and its influence in the sentence.

The sentence does not fit with the highlighted word as the sentence's tone is positive, the more suitable word is "commend" which means praise formally or officially.

Hence, the chosen option is correct.

In the question below, a word is given followed by three sentences. Find out the sentences in which the given word suits the best. If none of the sentences look appropriate as per the word, mark your answer as "All are correct".

7. AMBIGUITY

- I. Where the words are not clear, other factors can be taken into account to resolve the *ambiguity*.
- II. Amanda had the *ambiguity* to show up to the party, despite the fact that she was not invited.

Sentence II does not fit with the highlighted word as the sentence's tone is different from the word, the more suitable word is "audacity" which means a willingness to take bold risks.

Hence, the chosen option is correct.

8. DISPARAGING

I. It is, in any case, unfair to decide questions by *disparaging* terms and to argue as if the whole choice were between materialistic or idealistic monism, leaving realism out of court.

All the sentences seem to be coherent to the word.

Hence, the chosen option is correct.

9. VILIFY.

- I. Why are people so quick to *vilify* those on the "other side" of the issue—and why do we even think in terms of sides?

The word "Vilify" means to speak or write about in an abusively disparaging (derogatory) manner.


In this regard, sentences I and II seem to be coherent with the word and its influence in the sentence.

Hence, the chosen option is correct.

10. Judicial reforms, if taken seriously, *expeditious* and effective justice can see the light of day.



Solution

The correct answer is option A i.e. Alacritous.

The meaning of the word expeditious is 'done with speed and efficiency.'

'Alacritous' is the synonym of the given word as it means 'brisk or lively.'

The meanings of the other words:

sluggish: slow-moving or inactive.

inefficient: not achieving maximum productivity

pragmatic: dealing with things sensibly and realistically.

Hence, option A is the correct answer.





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
