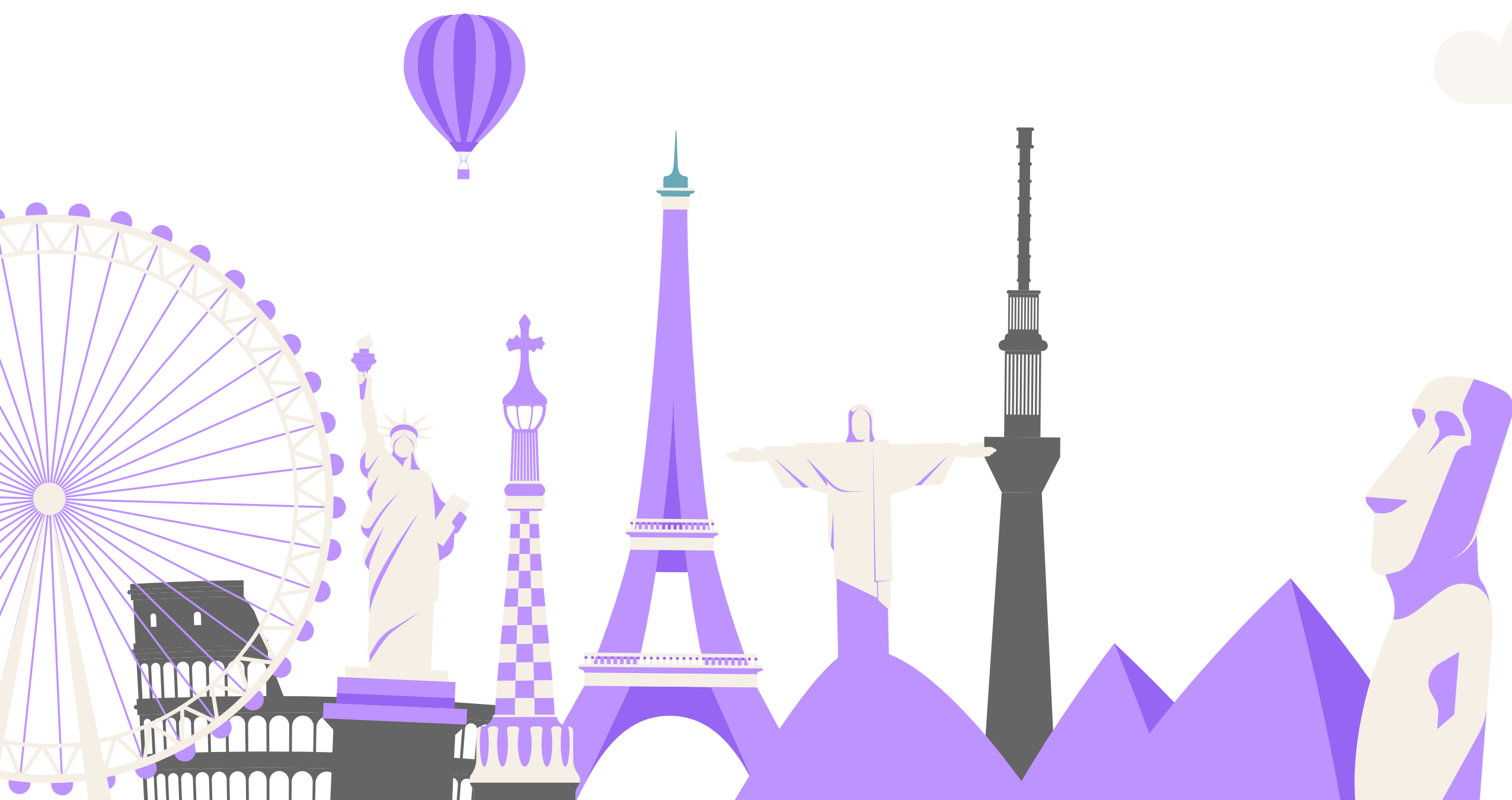




# TRAVEL

## Wanderlust
