#### MATHEMATICS

Number system, BODMAS, Decimals, Fractions, LCM, HCF, Ratio and Proportion, Percentages, Mensuration, Time and Work; Time and Distance, Simple and Compound Interest, Profit and Loss, Algebra, Geometry and Trigonometry, Elementary Statistics, Square Root, Age Calculations, Calendar & Clock, Pipes & Cistern etc.

The broad topics that are covered under this shall be Engineering Drawing (Projections, Views, Drawing Instruments, Lines, Geometric figures, Symbolic Representation), Units, Measurements, Mass Weight and Density, Work Power and Energy, Speed and Velocity, Heat and Temperature, Basic Electricity, Levers and Simple Machines, Occupational Safety and Health, Environment Education, IT Literacy etc.

#### GENERAL AWARENESS

Knowledge of Current affairs, Indian geography, culture and history of India including freedom struggle, Indian Polity and constitution, Indian Economy, Environmental issues concerning India and the World, Sports, General scientific and technological developments etc.

#### **COMPUTER BASED APTITUDE TEST (CBAT)**

#### (Only for candidates who have opted for ALP)

- Minimum Qualifying Marks for this stage are 42 marks in each of the test batteries, irrespective of the category.
- The CBAT shall have questions and answer options only in English and Hindi.
- There shall be no negative marking in CBAT.
- The merit list of RRB ALP will be shortlisted as 70% weightage will be allotted to the marks obtained in Part A of the second stage of CBT (CBT -2) and 30% weightage will be for the marks obtained in CBAT.
