- Aryabhata was launched on 19 April 1975 from Kapustin Yar, Russia, aboard a Cosmos-3M rocket.
- Main Objectives Astronomical experiment, research on gamma and X-ray radiation, etc.
- Re-entered the Earth's atmosphere in 1992 and burned up.
- Project Director Udupi Ramachandra Rao
- ISRO Chairman at the time of launch Satish Dhawan
- Indian Prime Minister at the time of launch Indira Gandhi

- Country which announced in April 2025 that it would withdraw its membership from the Hague-based International Criminal Court - Hungary
- President ousted by South Korean Parliament through impeachment Yoon Suk Yeol

 - → The allegations include manipulation of the distribution of mobile applications used on iOS and iPad devices between April 2021 and July 2023.

 - → Reciprocal tariffs have been announced for about sixty countries that impose high tariffs on US products.
- The country that installed the Three Gorges Antarctic Eye telescope in Antarctica

 - → The telescope was installed at the Zhongshan Station in Antarctica.
 - → The telescope was developed in collaboration with China's Three Gorges University and Shanghai Normal University.

- The Immigration and Foreigners Bill 2025, which aims to amend and consolidate immigration laws to curb illegal immigration in the country, was introduced in the Rajya Sabha by- Nityanand Rai (Union Minister of State for Home Affairs).
 - → The Immigration and Foreigners Bill 2025 was passed by the Lok Sabha on 27 March 2025.

- → The Rajya Sabha passed the bill by voice vote on 2 April 2025.
- → The new bill has been formed by combining the Foreigners Act (1946), the Passport (Entry into India) Act (1920), the Registration of Foreigners Act (1939), and the Immigration (Carriers' Liability) Act (2000).

 April 2025
 - → Passed by Lok Sabha 03 April 2025
 - → Passed by Rajya Sabha 04 April 2025
 - → The Waqf Act, 1995, is an important law that regulates the religious properties of Muslims in India. The Waqf Amendment Bill 2025 seeks to amend the Waqf Act, 1995.
 - → The bill, introduced in August 2024, was sent to the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) by the central government following opposition from various political parties. The revised bill was introduced in 2025 with the changes suggested by the committee.
- New Pampan Rail Bridge at Rameswaram, the first vertical lift sea bridge in the country, was inaugurated in April 2025 by - Narendra Modi (Prime Minister of India)
 - → The new Pamban Bridge was built after the old Pamban Bridge was decommissioned in December 2022 due to age.
 - → Pamban is India's first vertical lift railway sea bridge.
 - → Pamban is a railway sea bridge that connects Pamban Island in Ramanathapuram district and the pilgrimage center of Rameswaram.

 - → A composite license for a lithium block is a permit that allows exploration and mining of lithium in a specific area.

 - → The Fram 2 mission is carrying four passengers aboard SpaceX's Crew Dragon capsule, Resilience.
 - → The Fram 2 mission is led by cryptocurrency entrepreneur Chun Wang.
 - → Unlike typical spacecraft, Fram 2 orbits the Earth in a north-south direction. This is the first time a human-carrying space mission has orbited the Earth in a 90-degree polar orbit.

- → SpaceX named its polar space mission after the Fram, a Norwegian ship that explored the North and South Poles in the 19th century.
- NASA's rover which recently discovered the largest organic molecules ever found on Mars - Curiosity
- A digital platform launched to ensure the availability of rabies and snake venom vaccine at health centers in the country - ZooWIN
 - → The portal was developed by the National Center for Disease Control (NCDC).
- An indigenously designed and developed training aircraft launched by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and National Aerospace Laboratories (NAL) - Hansa-3 (NG)
- Long-range glide bomb successfully tested by DRDO from Su-30 MKI aircraft in April 2025 - Gaurav
- India's first indigenously developed laser-based weapon capable of neutralizing aircraft, missiles and drones - Surya
 - → The weapon was developed by the Defense Research and Development Organization (DRDO).
- The sub-orbital spaceflight mission that crewed mission of six-woman on Blue
 Origin's New Shepard rocket on April 14, 2025 Blue Origin NS-31
 - → NS-31 was the eleventh human spaceflight in the New Shepard program.

→ The passengers were singer Katy Perry, producer Kerrian Flynn, activist Amanda Nguyen, aerospace engineer Aisha Bowe, journalist Gayle King, and pilot and journalist Lauren Sanchez.

 - → She was the founder of the Kadamba Centre for Dance in Ahmedabad.
 - → Kumudini Lakhia worked as a choreographer in the Hindi film Umrao Jaan (1981).
 - → She worked as the Chairperson of the Sangeet Natak Akademi in 1990-91.
 - → She also received the Tagore Ratna Award of the Sangeet Natak Akademi in 2012.
 - → Winner of the Guru Gopinath National Natya Puraskar in 2021.
 - → The country honored him with the Padma Shri in 1987, the Padma Bhushan in 2010, and the Padma Vibhushan in 2025.

- Environmental activist known as the 'Tree Man' of Telangana who passed away in April 2025 - Daripally Ramaiah
 - → He was also known as 'Vanajeevi' for his pioneering work in afforestation.
 - → More than one crore saplings were planted as part of environmental protection.
 - → The country honored him with the Padma Shri in 2017 for his contributions to environmental protection.
- A renowned Malayali cardiologist known as the 'Father of Angioplasty' in India,
 who passed away in April 2025 Dr. Mathew Samuel Kalarikkal
 - → Dr. Mathew Samuel Kalarikkal performed the first angioplasty in India in 1986 and was instrumental in setting up angioplasty facilities in several countries in the Asia-Pacific region.
 - → He was awarded the Padma Shri by the country in 2000.
- The head of the global Catholic Church who passed away in April 2025 Pope Francis
 - → Real name Jorge Mario Bergoglio
 - → Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina.
 - → On March 13, 2013, Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio was elected the 266th Pope of the Catholic Church.
 - → Pope Francis was the first pope from Latin America.
- Prominent historian, teacher and writer who passed away in April 2025 Prof.
 M.G.S. Narayanan
 - → Full name Muttayil Govindamenon Sankara Narayanan
 - → Served as the Chairman of the Indian Council of Historical Research (2001–03).

- → The autobiography titled Jalakangal : oru charithranweshiyude vazhikal, kazhchakal won the 2019 Kerala Sahitya Akademi Award.

 - → He oversaw the formulation of the National Education Policy 2020.
 - → He was awarded the Padma Shri in 1982, the Padma Bhushan in 1992 and the Padma Vibhushan in 2000.
- Famous Malayalam film director and cinematographer who passed away in April
 2025 Shaji N. Karun
 - → He made his debut in Malayalam cinema as a cinematographer and worked behind the camera in about 40 films.
 - → His first film as a director was 'Piravi'.
 - → Films directed Piravi, Swapnam, Swaham, Vanaprastham, Nishad, Oolu, Kutty Srank

- → He was the first chairman of the Kerala State Chalachitra Academy, which was formed in 1998. He also held the position of chairman of the International Film Festival of Kerala (IFFK).
