**450 families from various castes.**

**SCs (Dalits) make up 1/3rd of the population, living in smaller mud and straw houses.**

**80 upper-caste families own most of the land and live in larger brick houses.**

**Most houses have electricity.**

**Two primary schools, one high school, and a government-run health center with a private dispensary.**

**Well-developed infrastructure including roads, transport, electricity, irrigation, schools, and healthcare.**

# Factors responsible for production

- Land
- Labour
- Capital (Physical Capital , Human Capital )
- Entrepreneurship

## Factors of Production:

**Land: Refers to natural resources, including raw property and commercial real estate. It's a primary factor as it generates economic value, e.g., land for farming or office buildings.**



**Labor: Human effort contributing to production. It includes all work performed, with workers paid for their time and expertise.  
Examples: farmers in agriculture or developers in tech.**



**Capital: Man-made resources used in production, such as machinery, tools, and equipment. Capital facilitates the creation of goods and services, e.g., computers, forklifts.**



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**Entrepreneurship: The initiative and investment made by entrepreneurs to start and grow a business, combining land, labor, and capital. Example: A software developer creating a new platform using their own resources and labor.**
